

RE-Entry Guidelines for our Church Building on Sundays

I hope you're as excited as I am to begin worship in our sanctuary! For some people moving worship indoors is not exciting or even possible. So we will continue to provide worship online during this crazy time.

We all love each other very much! For this reason there will be a few rules we'll need to follow inside the building. Church Council has been working through some guidelines to keep us all safe and healthy and passed these guidelines last week.



- ⇒ For the safety of everyone, face coverings will be required in our church building.
- ⇒ We need to limit our time inside the building so services will be 30 minutes long. We're going to continue with just one service for now but will constantly evaluate the need for additional worship opportunities.
- ⇒ We ask that you fellowship outside. It's been a long time and we all love to chat. Right after the service, let's move it outdoors and stay six feet apart. I can't wait to talk to you too!
- ⇒ It's important to keep everyone healthy as we worship. Please follow signs placed around the building and use hand sanitizer when you arrive. Our cleaning company has been doing a great job of cleaning our space. They will continue to sanitize all surfaces regularly. Please do your part and limit touching surfaces.
- ⇒ Since we need to provide distance between family groups, there will be rows of pews blocked off. Please follow the guidance as seen in the sanctuary. Due to space many of us will need to sit up in the balcony. You are welcome to enjoy a new perspective of the sanctuary from a new location.
- ⇒ We won't be singing during worship but feel free to hum along to the music. Clapping and dancing are also allowed.
- ⇒ We can't shake hands during greeting time but we can bump elbows or sign to each other.
- ⇒ Please leave your offering in the basket in the Narthex. This is also a really great time to set up regular electronic giving so you don't have to worry about forgetting your offering.
- ⇒ When its communion Sunday we will all use individual communion kits. Please dispose of these in a trash can.

The building will remain closed at all other times of the day. If you need to visit, please call the office to schedule an appointment. Know that we are all working hard to keep everyone safe so we can continue to worship together for a long time! — Kim Guardado, Council Chair





Mt. Vernon Churches Feed the "5,000"

We all are feeling the effects every day of the Pandemic and the terrible storm that came through in early August. We may feel all alone in the world, having to stay away from each other, wear our masks, wash and rewash our hands, and hear constant stories of loss and upheaval. Surely no time in history have people had to go through something so sad!

Actually, Eastern Iowa has experienced a variety of crises through the years, providing the toughest times and yet the most heartwarming and memorable opportunities to challenge our faith in Christ and God. Such was the case with the 2008 Flood in Cedar Rapids.

It was a Friday morning. The Cedar River was filling up with all the rain from the north. By noon, it had exceeded its banks. By 2:00, travelers on the bypass could barely see the tower from the Czech-Slovak Museum. All of south Cedar Rapids was totally immersed. By mid-afternoon, the water had made it to the downtown area, and as it was getting dark, First Responders were evacuating Mercy Hospital, taking patients to whatever community had available hospital beds.

All that spring, the stories of stores, homes, churches, senior citizen living facilities, schools that were completely inundated dominated our attention. The news media captured people who were trying to escape by boat, grabbing what they could, including pets. Whole neighborhoods were inundated; the high waters extended along the highways to Mount Vernon and Lisbon, inundating houses along the Cedar River and causing travelers to find other routes to get from town to town.

It took a few weeks for the drama to calm down and the realities to set in. Every building, every yard, every street in the Cedar Rapids area, was covered with a dark stinky slime. Homes were covered with it, inside and out. Even the safety deposit boxes in the banks had slime in them!

And that's when the story begins to change. (to be continued)



Prayers for Transition:


- For school administrators, the school board members and teachers as they work to serve students and families this year
