Pondering on the Paha: Dreaming

I sit in my office on the ancient hillside. The topography speaks of an ice age, windblown sediment, and a time before written history. I place my hands on the limestone blocks that form much of the church and feel the stories they would tell. Of the accumulation of sediment. Of eons underground. Of being quarried and carried up the hill. Of laborers and artisans. Of consecration and songs. They would tell stories of the people who worshipped inside these walls. Stories, long forgotten, of lives changed, commitments kept, and hopes shared. I am a blip in the story of the limestone. I am a passerby on the paha.

My first message series is about dreaming. I have a lot to learn about our story. My time here begins with intentional listening. I have our CAT results, our goals, and our church profile. I'm starting to get an idea of who we are, but it takes time. I invite us to dream together. There's so much we can do as a church. What is critical? What makes us who we are? What healing is needed? church at a unique place in its history. I'd invite you to dream with me, to pray with me. What does Mount Vernon need from our church? What does Cornell College need from us? What do we need from each other? What critical ministry is waiting for us? I don't know yet, but I'm dreaming.

Two things I do know: God loves you and I do too! I love your ready laughter. I love your generosity. I love the way you cherish the children of your church. I love the way you look out for each other with kind acts of care and consideration. Hove being in worship we

Sue and Emily discussed different cultures with the kids and how God loves every one of those people, and He loves all of us.

These kids had fun, I promise! This was at the end of the day and it had been a hot one. Overall, though, it was generally decent weather.

Our Family time was led by Pastor Roberta with the help of some youth group volunteers. The volunteers acted out skits teaching the story of the Good Samaritan, helped lead songs/activities, and stamped the "passports" issued to each attendee at the beginning of week. We also had a few youth wranglers who were skilled in helping kids to refocus energy in


