## Pondering on the Paha: On the Board

Pastor's Letter

I have a whiteboard in my office. It's crowded with several things I want to keep in front of me as I go about my work. "Love the church" is on the board. It might seem obvious, but sometimes I don't communicate love well.

Fisher and I met while we were both teaching in rural Estherville. The Monday after he proposed, I came to work with a ring, and the kids began to ask questions. When I said I was engaged to Mr. Fisher, there was silence then laughter. My concern for professionalism was such that very few people knew Mark and I were dating, let alone serious. "Love the church." I should probably add, "and tell them you love them!" In my sense of purpose, of mission, I don't always stop and say the words. I have been committed to loving every church I have been asked to serve, but some are easier to love than others. Friends, you are easy to love.

There are a lot of things on that whiteboard in addition to love: Communication (texts, videos, social media), Youth Group (MS & HS), Nominations, Confirmation, Church Conference, Stewardship, Disciple Making, Service/ Missions Opportunities, Property (challenges, repairs, cleaning), Committees (process, values, goals), Cornell, Staff, Adult Education, Social Justice Team, Townhalls. On the first of the month, I go through and update the board. Love, while seeming such a basic thing, stays on the board. In the midst of all the possible places to focus my time and energy, I don't want to forget love.

In Matthew 22, Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment and he answers, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. 'This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' All the law and the prophets hang on these." In John 13, Jesus gives his followers a new commandment, "love one another as I have loved you." Loving well. It's so easily missed in our anxieties and to do lists. What do I hope to accomplish here? I hope to love the church well, and to lead us in loving well.

A **Memorial Service** will be held on Sunday, September 3, 2023 at 3 p.m. at Collegiate United Methodist Church/Wesley Foundation (2622 Lincoln Way, Ames, IA 50014) with a luncheon immediately following the service.

**Rev. Seydel** served Assistant Professor of Chemistry & Director of Campus Ministry, University of Tennessee, Nashville, Tenn.; Assistant Professor of Chemistry, Tennessee State University; Associate Professor of Biology, Friends University, Wichita, Kans.; Associate Professor of Biology, Georgetown University, Washington, D.C.; Associate Director, Clergy Education in Human Genetics, Div. of Biochemical Genetics, Div. of Genetics, Georgetown University, Washington



D.C.; Director-Clergy Education in Genetics, Biochemical Genetics Laboratory, Georgetown University; Mount Vernon, First; and Mount Vernon, The United Methodist Church. He retired in 2011.

**Survivors** include his wife, Lynn (616 18th St. Ames, IA 50010); his son, David of York, PA; and three grandchildren, Kaitlyn, Ethan, and Madeline; and his daughter, Roxanne of Springfield, VA. **Frank D. Seydel** was born on May 15, 1944, in Davenport, Iowa, to Robert Emory Seydel and Mildred Faye Gauley Seydel. In 1947 his family moved across the Mississippi River to Moline, Illinois. Frank attended the Moline school system and graduated from 12th grade in 1962. He attended Iowa Wesleyan College, Mount Pleasant, Iowa, graduating with a B.S. degree in 1966, with dual majors in biology and chemistry and a minor in math.

He received his Ph.D, in Biochemistry—Cell Biology from Iowa State University in 1973 and a Master of Divinity Degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1976 and was ordained Elder in the Iowa Conference of the United Methodist Church in 1980. He taught chemistry at the University of Tennessee, Nashville, 1976-1980, biology and chemistry at Friends University, Wichita, KS, 1980-1983. He was Director of the Prenatal Screening Program and Associate Director and then Director of Clergy Education in Genetics At Georgetown University Medical Center, 1983-1999. He received his Board certification in Genetic Counseling in 1989. He was a member of Phi Kappa Phi, academic honorary, and Sigma Xi, scientific honorary. Frank was active in the Mid-Atlantic Region Human Genetics Network; he was chair of the Education Committee for 10 years and chair of the Ethics Committee for three years. He was also active in developmental disability issues, especially the United Methodist Church's Task Force on Developmental Disability, where he served as secretary, chair, or vice chair for 10 years.

He was pastor of the Mount Vernon United Methodist Church, 1999-2011; growing the church by 33%, completing a million dollar building addition to the church, and adding an associate pastor.

In 1970 he married Lynn Swanson of Ames, Iowa. This past April 18th, they celebrated 53 years of marriage. Both their son, David, and their daughter, Roxanne, were born in Nashville, TN. Flower gardening and cooking were his passions. In retirement he was also active in the Story County Republican Party, where he served three years as treasurer.

## **Finance Committee Updates**

What is the state of the General Fund?

As of July 30th the fund is positive \$17,243. You may recall we started January 1st with a positive balance of \$55,371, so the fund has decreased \$38K in the past 7 months. There was an increase from June to July of \$500, mainly due to income of \$3,300 from the Heritage Days food booth. Thanks to all who participated in/supported the food booth and also to those donors who continue to contribute to the General Fund.

What is the state of the Education Wing Renovation Project?

The finishing touches are being completed. The preschool was able to have their open house on Friday, August 25th and the office staff are looking forward to moving into the new & improved office space. The Trustees are estimating the total cost of the project to be \$325K. As of today we have received pledges/contributions of \$277,299 to cover the costs of the project; the total funding is around \$47K short of the need. Therefore, the church will need to take out a loan from the Mount Vernon Bank and Trust as approved prior to the start of the project. Final costs and donations received in September will help determine the exact amount of the loan required. Thanks to all who have supported this project!





From Pastor Vicki: Nominations season begins!


