Iowa Disaffiliation News:

The disaffiliation window has closed in Iowa with another 59 churches choosing to leave the denomination. This is in addition to the 83 who left in June. About 600 United Methodist churches remain in the Iowa Conference. Across the US, about 20% are expected to leave the denomination as disaffiliation ends. The overwhelming majority of these churches are choosing to leave because they are opposed LGBTQ persons in church leadership and to churches hosting same -sex marriage. While each church can create its own marriage policy, these churches wanted denomination-wide enforcement of a ban on same sex marriages and LGBTQ clergy. The denomination is steadily moving towards tolerance of differences.

 Neighbors in Need Fund \$1,005 donated As we all think about our year-end gifts to the church, consider donating securities from your investment portfolio. The church can accept any negotiable securities: stocks, bonds, mutual funds. A gift of securities benefits the donor two ways: you receive the usual charitable tax deduction, and you avoid capital gains tax on the sale proceeds. This strategy is particularly useful if you have owned the assets for a long time and have a large unrealized gain.

To get this favorable tax treatment, it is important that the securities are given to the church before they are sold. The Iowa United Methodist Foundation (which manages part of our church endowment) will sell the securities at no cost to either the donor or the church, and write a check to UMCMV. Proceeds can be directed to whichever church fund you specify.

If you wish to learn more about donating securities, call the church office; they will connect you with the Foundation and provide the necessary documents.

If you are considering a yearend donation to the church, consider making a qualified charitable donation (QCD) from your individual retirement account (IRA). Here's how:

If you are 70¹/₂ or older, you can donate funds from your IRA to any qualifying charity (including UMCMV), and the donated amount is not taxable to you, as IRA distributions usually are. This is true whether or not you itemize deductions on your tax return. If you are 73 or older at the end of 2023, you MUST take a distribution from your IRA before yearend. You can donate all or a portion of this required minimum distribution (RMD) to charity, and avoid paying tax on the donated amount. Please note that, in order to avoid income tax, the donation must be made DIRECTLY from the custodian of your IRA to the church. That makes it a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) under IRS rules, and the distributed amount is not taxable to the IRA owner.

Every financial firm that offers IRAs has a process for doing this. Contact the custodian of your IRA for instructions on their procedure. Also, contact the church office, so they will know what to do with the check when it arrives.

This tax-saving strategy is only available to owners of IRAs that were funded with pre-tax dollars, not to owners of Roth IRAs, whose qualifying distributions are not taxable.

- With thankful hearts we praise God for the blessings in our lives


