## Pondering on the Paha: Who are We?

A number of years ago, I went to a workshop about using our core values to guide challenging decisions. My colleague shared about using values to shape choices on a personal level and within the church. We then unpacked how to



identify and nurture our core values personally and in the church community. We thrive in places where our values align, and struggle when our values don't quite fit.

Core values answer the questions: "Who are we? What defines us? What is important to us? What are the non-negotiables? What do we hope never changes?" Core values are more about how we actually live, than about the goals we have.

My core values are Family, Curiosity, Hospitality, and Faith. I thrive when I have space to play with my family, when I can ask questions and focus on learning, when outsiders are embraced, and when I can live my faith. I am most at home when I honor these values.

In the same way, churches have values that they are living out. Several months ago, I went through a process with our staff to lift up the core values they were noticing. More recently, our Church Council took time to identify our core values. The lists between these two groups were almost the same.

The core values of UMCMV identified by our Church Council:

- 1. Embrace everyone as who they are.
- 2. Quality worship with great music.
- 3. Involvement of all ages both inside and outside the church.
- 4. Generosity.

Programs and activities that reflect the above values are more likely to be embraced by the congregation and succeed. I'm excited to see where our church leadership takes these values and how we live them out in 2024! is and isn't.





#### **2024 Finance Committee UPDATE**

What are the current balances of the General Fund and the Renovation Loan as of January 15, 2024? \$36,412 remains on the Education Wing Renovation Loan – down from the \$56,650 borrowed on 10/10/23 (including principle and interest).

**\$43,354.76** is the balance of the General Fund – down from **\$55,370.81** on 1/1/23.

The Church Council passed a balanced budget for 2024 with confidence that contributions will cover all expenses. However, the congregation should prayerfully consider making an additional gift above their 2024 pledge to help eliminate the Education Wing Renovation Loan (\$36,412 outstanding). As you recall we 'borrowed' the money from the church Endowment to cover the cost of the Ed Wing project. The 6 month note comes due on April 10, 2024. Rather than renew the note, we would love to pay the balance in full!

Maybe a portion of your tax refund could be donated or a special offering given which would allow us to pay off the Education Wing Renovation Loan and continue the good works of the church!
