#### Pondering on the Paha: Waiting for Easter

In Jerusalem, there would have been crowds everywhere. From lands far

and near they would have come to the holy city to commemorate the Passover with food, song, scripture, and sacrifice. Passover had begun with more than the usual amount of revelry. Quite a stir was caused by a young traveling preacher and healer, one Jesus of Nazareth. Hearts were exuberant as this gracious man rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, in essence proclaiming himself to be the king prophesied in scripture. "Save us now" the crowds shouted. And there was much to be saved from in Jerusalem. Rome's rule was crushing. The torture and death of anyone who visibly resisted their dominion left bodies of rebels hanging on crosses for all to see. Could this year in Jerusalem be the year that all was restored to God's chosen people? Could this carpenter's son from Nazareth be messiah in disguise? Could a people scattered and broken finally be brought home in glory?

By Friday afternoon, word has spread that things have gone horribly wrong. Jesus has been arrested and God allows it. The man who raised the dead and cleared the temple is silent. He was silent like a sheep going to slaughter. Jesus has let his followers down. All the hopes they placed on him flow away with each drop of blood he sheds. Someone cries out in mockery what his believers wish in their hearts, "Let him save himself." But Jesus does not. God does not rend the sky. Angels do not appear with swords. Friday closes with a body cooling in a dark grave. His followers who seemed fearless in his presence now are hiding in locked homes. Do they light the Sabbath candles when the light of their lives has been taken away? Do they pray to a God who has disappointed them so bitterly? Do they curse Rome and the priests and plot revenge in their whispers? Do they make plans to slip out of Jerusalem to go back home? Are they angry at Jesus for choosing to come to Jerusalem, even when he knew it was to die? Thoughts are in turmoil until exhaustion quiets the questions with troubled sleep.

Saturday passes with the Sabbath rest heavily upon the city of Jerusalem. It passes like a day after a funeral with too much exhaustion and pain for much focused thought. When nightfall comes, the women set to work. They don't care about the risk. They don't care about the horror. They are gathering spices to anoint Jesus body one last time. They will awake early on Sunday thinking there's one final gruesome mission ahead.


Waiting for Easter. It's a time in our lives when we do what we have to do without any joy or hope. We go through the motions. We walk the road to the tombs of our hopes and dreams. We ask 'why' a hundred times a day. In the meantime, God sees every tear, hears every prayer, and watches our heavy steps. If we listen, we can hear the promise whispering under the chaos. 'Resurrection,' says the voice. 'New life,' breathes the Spirit. 'Just hang on,' echoes the empty tomb. By faith in Jesus Christ, we too will see the resurrection. We too will see dreams healed, joys fulfilled, hopes renewed. Some of us will get a glimpse of this new hope on earth. Some of us will come to the end of our tears only when we stand before our savior. But by faith in Jesus, the resurrected one, I tell you most assuredly, believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved. Saved from a life without Easter Sunday. Saved from a meaningless death and a hopeless future.

He is risen! He is indeed! Blessings, Pastor Vicki



#### **Julian Johnston Scholarship Announced**

College students who are entering either their junior or senior year at an accredited 4-year institution for the 2024-25 academic year and who are members of the United Methodist Church of Mount Vernon are eligible for the Julian Johnston Scholarship award administered by the church's memorial committee.

Julian Johnston, a former Mount Vernon businessman, provided for this scholarship in his will as appreciation for money he received from this church to enable him to finish his education at Cornell. Dividends from his Chevron stock given to the church provide the funding for this scholarship. Awards may be \$500 or \$1000 depending on the number of chosen applications and the actual funds available

Applicants need to 1) fill out demographic information, 2) write a one-page letter describing the financial need and their career goals, and 3) provide a letter of recommendation to be considered by the evaluation committee. Application letters were emailed to our church members who were high school graduates in 2021 or 2022. Other eligible members may request application information from the church office. There is no age limit. Completed applications must be received by the church office by Monday June 10, 2024. Awards will be announced by June 28th.



## Pray for General Conference: General Conference is April 23-May 3, 2024

General Conference is the worldwide gathering of United Methodist delegates that occurs every four years. This will be the first General Conference since 2019 when the modified traditional plan was passed, increasing the penalties for officiating at same sex marriages and strengthening discriminatory language against gay people. Since General Conference 2019, several Annual Conferences, including lowa, have refused to enforce these changes. The lowa UMC is a safe place to be a married gay pastor and to officiate at same-sex weddings. Please pray for General Conference, that delegates might find a new direction for the UMC.

Congratulations, generous congregation. Our Bulk Food donation to SE Linn Food pantry for March is \$2600 of essential food items, ordered through Gary's Foods at bulk rate.

In sharing this donation with SE Linn, their director, Nicole McAlexander shared that we have become an ESSENTIAL part of their service to the community, and that we are the only organization that contributes this level of support. She then shared that she wished the community was more aware of their services and the needs they meet through the food pantry.



#### **Endowment Distribution**

Our endowment funds earned a modest return in 2023. In accordance with our endowment policy, the Endowment Ministry Team requested, and the Church Council approved, a distribution of \$6,000 from the endowment. Endowment distributions must be used for special projects or ministries that are not part of the church's annual budget.

The Church Council will act to approve one or more specific uses of this year's distribution at its meeting in April. In order to be eligible to receive funds from the endowment, the Council agreed on the following procedures and asks everyone wishing to request funds to follow them:

- 1. All the UMCMV program ministries (Missions, Education, Evangelism, Youth, Stewardship, Worship, Memorials, Membership Care, Peace/Justice) and administrative ministries (Trustees, Staff Parish, Finance, Lay Leadership) are eligible to request funds from the distribution.
- 2. If there is a request or idea for use of the funds from an individual in the congregation, it must first go through one of the program or administrative ministry teams above.
- 3. All requests must include the following:
- a. name of the project/program/event, etc. to be funded with this distribution
- b. name of the Council member or committee making the request
- c. description of what outcome is expected
- d. estimated cost
- e. availability of other funding sources if full funding from endowment is not possible

All requests should be sent to Alison Dix in the church office by April 12. The requests will be presented to the Council at its April meeting for discussion and a vote for selection.


