#### Pondering on the Paha: Heritage Days

Another Heritage Days is in the books, and fall planning is starting to pick up. My thanks to the Finance Team and the Missions Team for sharing the love of Christ through food and drink! We passed out over 400 bottles of water, plus numerous invitations to church. We served a lot of food, with smiles, despite the oppressive heat and humidity. Thanks to everyone who donated time and money to share the joy of Jesus with our community!

A 2019 survey by Religion in American Life, only 2% or 3% of people attended church because of advertising, while 85% went after being invited by a friend or relative. What about folks who have gone missing from worship? A study from the Lewis Center on Church leadership revealed the following, "Overall, 41% of the formerly churched said they would return to the local church if a friend or acquaintance invited them. Younger adults are even more influenced by the power of the invitation. Approximately 60% of those 18–35 would consider returning to church if someone they knew asked them to come back." A personal invitation from you is the most effective way to get people in the doors. A warm and genuine welcome from you is the best way to help folks connect once they are here.



As we start thinking about fall, I want you to pray about saying "yes". Yes to helping in our children's ministries. Yes to being a part of music ministry. Yes to inviting a neighbor, or calling a friend who's been absent from worship. Yes to being the first impression of the church by ushering. Yes to serving in leadership or helping with building and grounds. We have a lot of people working faithfully, but there's room for more!

What an amazing Heritage Days we shared! I can't wait to see what we accomplish next!



## Do you want to learn more about Life Groups? Keep reading! Life Groups FAQ

- 1. What is a Life Group? A private group of people to live life with building connections, providing support for one another, growing in faith and sharing life's ups and downs.
- 2. How often do they meet? We're thinking weekly or every other week to get started.
- 3. If I was in a life group before, would I be in the group? So much has changed since we last offered life groups. We plan to change things up a little so we can meet new people.
- 4. Where do we meet and for how long each meeting? Life groups are typically held in someone's home but the church would be available as well. 60-90 minutes is about the typical length of a life group meeting.
- 5. What do we do in a life group? We can share our highs and lows, pray with and for each other and grow our faith.
- 6. How do we decide who should be in each group? When we complete the sign-up, we will pray over the list and let the Holy Spirit guide placement into groups. Check the sign up for more information about timing and preference. We'd like to form intergenerational groups with opportunities for everyone to get to know someone new from our church. And your children are welcome!
- 7. What is the timeline? We will be sharing information and recruiting during August and early September. We hope to start groups in late September or early October.
- 8. How can I get involved? We're looking for people interested in joining a group, hosting a group and/or facilitating a group. Look for the sign-up in the church bulletin or call the office for more information.
- 9. Who can I ask to learn more about these groups? Babs Moore, Ann Coe and Kim Guardado are all helping to facilitate the groups. Ask any of us for more information.


