# **Pastor's Letter**

September has been such a strange month. There's been all the excitement around the church as fall programming resumes. The Bell Choir and Chancel Choir are practicing. Children and Youth are everywhere. The hallways are filled with excited voices during Sunday School. I've been helping with our shared high school and middle school groups. The youth are asking such wonderful questions. I love watching them grow in their faith.

In all that joy, there is the background noise of national struggles, along with neighbors who are hurting. There's the ongoing crisis in Israel and Ukraine. I've listened to church members talk about their work to get out the vote, and stock SELCC's pantry. We are longing for a nation where the vulnerable are welcomed, protected, and valued. We are longing for a nation that follows our God's mandate to care for the least of these. We are longing for leaders who want to work together, rather than demonize each other. Our political system is broken, in that it pushes us to extremes, rather than cooperation. There are different paths that we do not take, in part because those in power are reluctant to give it up.

"In Longing and Hope" is the name of the community worship service the night before the election. (See details in this newsletter.) It's an apt description of this season where we realize that politics have revealed deep divisions in our country. I find myself longing for heated debates about tax codes! I find hope, when I look for it. In the people I work with. In our care for people who are hurting. In the children and youth of our communities. I look at them, and I long for a better world that is safe and whole.

One of my colleagues used to say, "work or prayer – usually the answer is in one or both of them." United Methodists are people of faith in action. I find I need both! I need to feel like I'm making a difference and I also need to have long talks with Jesus. I would add a third answer: community. We are called to walk with each other, even as we wait, in longing and hope. Thanks for walking with us!





#### MUNDO UPDATE-10.2024

Praise the Lord! You may have heard some exciting news about Mundo's case being approved and then very quickly asked yourself, "What exactly does that mean?" First, thank you all for your support as we've navigated this lengthy and challenging process. Your prayers, your gifts, and your support, have all been felt as we've moved through this process. I'll try to outline these

steps for us all to understand a little better.

What happened? Mundo's I-601A was approved. This is basically the largest hurdle in the process. If we were describing this visually, I would tell you that we've crossed the summit of the mountain. We haven't made it to safety yet, but we know that the hardest part is done.

What's coming? Next is the visa application, DS-260. We have a few more documents to collect and this will get submitted. When the visa application is approved, he will be scheduled for a visit and interview in El Salvador. We don't know yet when this will happen, but hopefully this year. Mundo will be gone anywhere from 3 weeks to 3 months.

Then what? He comes home!

We can't thank you enough for everything, from kind words to meaningful prayers. All of it means so much! As we continue this final phase, please continue your payers. They all matter! Thank you for lifting us up over the mountain!

## **Mission Committee October Update**

Our committee is back in full swing for the fall, anxious to keep the congregation updated and involved in this important outreach in our church.

On Sunday, September 8, we had a guest speaker at both services, updating us on the country of Haiti and its ongoing struggles. Renee Dietrich, sister of Denny Dietrich of Gary's Foods, has been working for many years as the Secretary/Treasurer of Friends of

Saint Joseph's Family, a grassroots organization that ministers to disadvantaged youth in Haiti. Renee had lots of information, slides, and materials that will help us be informed and involved with this neighboring country torn apart by violence, poverty, and lack of education. Our congregation responded to this international outreach with a generous offering of over \$2500 which has been forwarded to Saint Joseph's Family in Haiti.

We have received orders for our quarterly bulk food donation to the SE Linn Food Pantry, and the food items are to be delivered on Oct. 2. SE Linn continues to be very grateful for our generous donations for this important community support.

Our Mission committee is hoping to organize a Service Sunday for the spring and we're looking for volunteers to help make this great event happen. Please contact Alison if you'd like to be involved.

## Scrip Case Study – Gary's Foods

We all need groceries and many of us purchase some or all at Gary's Foods. For each \$100 gift card sold, Gary's contributes \$5 back to the church.

If I purchased \$200 in gift cards each month for Gary's that would be a \$10 contribution. Over a year's time that would be \$120!

If ten people did the same it would be \$1200. If fifty people did the same it would be \$6000. See how quickly the contribution can add up for the church?

What is in it for Gary's? They get the \$\$ up front and don't have to pay any credit card fees. They also expand their sales as more folks may choose to shop there to utilize the Scrip Program.




#### **Inclusion Team: Join us!**


